

Be A Good Neighbour — Respect "No Trespassing"

We have a few neighbours who own property that borders on our road system. These neighbours have expressed concern for constant trespassing by ATVs, dog walkers and pedestrian traffic. "No Trespassing" signs are being torn down and access barriers are being removed. We ask that our members not be among those that do not respect the wishes of our neighbours. Please do not trespass on the following private property:

- The property opposite lake side and beyond the end of Hilltop Lane
- The property opposite lake side on the hill on Star Lake Woods Rd.
- The properties on both sides of the common road
- The property on the right side of Morningside Dr. when turning off Star Lake Woods Rd.

If permitted under COVID-19 restrictions, when you have guests, please remember to advise them not to enter these restricted areas. It is private property that is not part of our cottage road system or within the property lines of our member cottages.

Safety First

Boating Safety

It's time to get the boat back in the lake for another season of fun on the water. Whether you are tubing, wakeboarding, skiing or just enjoying a ride around the lake, remember that large waves close to shore can cause:

- Land erosion
- Water quality degradation
- Dock and boat damage
- Wildlife/Fish habitat destruction

We all share space on one of the most beautiful lakes in the area and all our members as well as our neighbours have a right to enjoy it.

Remember to:

- Protect our water quality
- Respect aquatic life and wildlife
- Respect each other's right to enjoy being on the water
- Follow the Safe Boater's Code of Conduct



- 1. I will never operate my boat beyond the level of my skills.
- 2. I will be aware of and obey all laws and regulations governing operation of my boat.
- 3. I will operate my boat with caution and courtesy to others at all times.
- 4. I will minimize my wake impact on shorelines, docks, structures and people.
- 5. I will always steer well clear of other boats, swimmers and wildlife.
- I will set a speed and heading that is safe and comfortable for my passengers and others on the water.
- I will provide safety instructions and offer appropriate life jackets or PFDs to everyone who travels in my boat.
- 8. I will carry all equipment necessary to operate my boat safely and within the law.
- 9. I will not consume drugs and alcohol in my boat or allow my boat to be operated by anyone who is impaired.
- 10. I understand that boating is a shared experience and I will not create excessive noise or operate my boat in a manner that disrupts the peaceful enjoyment of the lake by others.

West Parry Sound Pool & Wellness Centre

This is a huge project proposal that many neighbouring townships, including Seguin, have pledged their support. However, there is also a growing number of ratepayers in these townships that are strongly against the project. Those that are against the project cite it's size, contending that it is far too large for the population and will run at a deficit. The cost of the project and the annual deficit will have to be covered by property tax increases estimated at a minimum of 4% p.a. Your board is not advocating a for or against position. Humphrey Nature Trails are perfect for summer hiking.



COVID-19 UPDATE

No known issues on Star Lake – while in lockdown, please remember:

- For members who enjoy permanent residence at the cottage, only members of your household should be permitted inside
- When this is not possible, for example to allow a maintenance worker inside, masks should be worn by all
- ♦ For members whose permanent residence is not the cottage, only members who live with you should visit your cottage
- Maintain social distancing (2 meters apart)
- Wear a mask when social distancing cannot be maintained
- The Provincial lockdown has been extended to June 2nd, 2021
- The number of vaccinated Ontarians is increasing rapidly as shipments of vaccine arrive on time and more individuals roll up their sleeves
- Over 50% of Parry Sound North Bay adult residents have received at least one dose of the vaccine (as of May 20th)
- Cautious optimism for relaxation of restrictions for the upcoming summer season.
